SUMMER CELEBRATIONS

The summer officially begins with our **4th Annual Memorial Day Pancake Breakfast** at the White Lake Inn on Monday, May 30th from 8:30 until 11:30 a.m. We will once more be serving our delicious pancakes, sausage, and scrambled eggs, with milk, juice, and coffee. Prices will be the same as last year - \$6.00 (\$3.00 for children under 10). At noon, we will again honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country by playing "Taps" and then raising the flag to full mast with the singing of our national anthem.

Starting in May, we will have our fundraising merchandise available on Fridays at the White Lake Inn. Merchandise will also be available on Memorial Day at the Pancake Breakfast.

The **Annual Boat Parade** is scheduled for Saturday July 2nd at 2:15 p.m. leaving from Mitchell's Marina bay. Our theme this year is **CHRISTMAS IN JULY!** Let's all decorate and light up our boats (and our docks!) for the holiday weekend. This is something EVERYONE can participate in... fun for adults, children, grandchildren, and families! Use whatever you already have, so your family and friends can enjoy a "Christmas in July". Be creative: possible themes are Christmas carols, holiday movies, Christmas around the world, anything holiday or Christmas!

This year we are also encouraging everybody to get into the "holiday" spirit by decorating their docks and waterfronts for the weekend as well - even if you don't participate in the boat parade! (Remember to plug any lights that you use near the water into a ground fault protected (GFCI) outlet.) Boaters can enjoy cruising around the lake on Friday and Sunday nights viewing the lights as well.

All boat teams in the parade will receive a gift bag. Votes will be taken again by phone from all our friends and neighbors watching on shore (or on a boat). The phone number and voting instructions will be on our website. AND, this year there will be a special "Judges Boat" for special grand prizes donated by local businesses.

Of course, our spectacular 2 barge **Fireworks Display** will begin at dusk on Saturday evening. This is always one of the highlights of the summer!

Finally, on a Saturday afternoon in August, we will hold an **Old Fashioned Ice Cream Social** to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the White Lake Citizens League in 1961. Come and enjoy free ice cream, cake, and children's activities. All of the details will be announced on the website and by e-mail.

SHERIFF'S MARINE PATROLS

Yes, this was a somewhat controversial subject at the beginning of the boating season last year, but the White Lake Improvement Board decided to spend existing funds from the Special Assessment District (SAD) to pay for Oakland County Sheriff's Patrols on our lake last summer.

As you may remember, Oakland County dramatically reduced funding for all Marine Patrols last year, instead offering individual lakes the option to privately fund the patrols on their lake. In order to ensure the safety of boaters, swimmers, and residents on our lake, White Lake was one of several of the county's largest lakes which elected to fund the patrols.

In total, the Sheriff patrolled 36 days on our lake in 2010, covering weekends, holidays, and occasional weekdays during the entire period from Memorial Day to Labor day. The total cost was just over \$5000, which amounts to about \$3.25 per Special Assessment District home* for the entire season. No additional tax assessment was required to fund this service.

By the end of the summer, most agreed that the patrols had been beneficial to the safety of our lake. The presence of the patrols most likely saved the life of one person involved in an alcohol-related near-drowning.

Everyone is encouraged to click on the "Sheriff Lake Patrols" button on the left side of our website to view the detailed 2010 statistics and report provided by the Sheriff's Office, as well as the history and process involved in funding these patrols.

While we all wish that Oakland County would return to funding these patrols, until improvements in the economy allow that to happen, existing SAD funds will again be used to fund patrols in 2011.

Eric Russell, a lake resident who has served in the United States Coast Guard, has agreed to be the liaison between White Lake and the Oakland County Marine Unit this year. While many of the parameters for the patrols are established in the contract with the county, residents are encouraged to contact Eric at **patrols@wlcl.org** or call the WLCL Hot Line (248-887-5658) with their reasonable questions, concerns, and suggestions this summer.

*There are approximately 1600 homes in the Special Assessment District, including about 600 lakefront homes.

E-MAIL COMMUNICATIONS

Whether you're a member of the White Lake Citizens League or not, you can receive up-to-date information and reminders about lake and lake-area activities by joining the WLCL e-mail list. Since this printed newsletter is only mailed once a year, the website and these e-mails are your best way to keep up on White Lake information.

Here are the promises we make:

- · e-mail addresses are always hidden from view on all communications
- · e-mail addresses are never supplied or sold to any other organization
- e-mails are always short and easy to read, and never contain graphics or pictures (which can slow their downloading on some systems)
- e-mails are limited to 1 or 2 a month, except around special events (like the Boat Parade)
- · you can ask to have your name removed from the list at any time

Presently there are 366 members, non-members, and local businesses on the master list to receive e-mail communications. E-mail addresses are removed from the list when the carrier "bounces" a message back indicating that the address is no longer valid... so you may have formerly received the e-mails, changed carriers, and forgotten to notify us of your new e-mail.

If you haven't been receiving e-mails lately, you can add your e-mail address to the list by sending an e-mail to **communication@wlcl.org**, or by including it on your membership form (please print carefully... some e-mails "bounce" because they are difficult to read on the form!)

SAILBOAT RACES

There was a time when our lake was full of small colorful sailboats of various sizes and types. At that time, lake residents could go out on their decks on a summer Sunday and gaze upon a colorful fleet of as many as thirty sailboats engaged in a friendly race around the lake. Participants and viewers alike loved it.

A group is considering starting sailboat races on the lake again. The group is having an initial get together on Thursday May 26th at 7:00 p.m. to discuss the best dates, times, locations, and rules for such informal races.

The group may develop into a sailing club in which more experienced sailors could help those with little or no experience to learn boathandling and boat repair skills.

WATER QUALITY AND WEED TREATMENT

It's 2011 and we still are having to deal with weeds on our lake... Sewers to service the houses around the shoreline and surrounding area would be the ultimate answer for our lake, though it would be a slow reversal of the effect that septic systems and other sources of surface runoff have done to the nutrient levels already accumulated at the bottom and in the water column of White Lake.

One of our jobs at the WLCL is to put forth a program every year to treat the symptoms that excess nutrient levels in our lake present. This year's program will be similar to many recent years of treatment. Those prior year's treatments evolved from the beginning, with weed harvesting about 30 years ago - which didn't do a very good job of controlling weed growth. Some would argue that it may have even stimulated growth of certain weed species. Because sewers are not installed (due to the huge amount of money they would cost), and because extensive dredging is expensive (though we have accomplished some dredging), we treat our lake with a reasonably cost effective program of chemical treatments throughout the summer. For those of you who wonder why we haven't explored methods other than chemicals - we have explored them.

As mentioned earlier, this year's program will be patterned after what we know works... It will start with a weed survey this spring, followed by a chemical treatment based on what we find. More than likely, we will find a lot of a weed known as Starry Stonewart this year (identification pictures are available on "Water Quality & Weed Control" page of the website). With our contractor, we have developed an application of chemicals that is effective on that growth. Throughout the summer, we will do additional weed surveys to identify any additional nuisance weed growth issues, and then treat them with the chemical applications required.

You may have noticed that sometimes certain areas of the lake receive treatment applications while others do not. Based on our surveys, we will sometimes apply specific treatments only to those areas with specific nuisance weed problems.

We remind all residents around the lake to be observant, and to report any unusual nuisance weed growth issues to the WLCL Hot Line (248-887-5658). We will respond to every call and confirm your observations. Keep in mind, however, that we don't try to maintain a swimming pool here! It is a lake, and some weeds are supposed to grow to maintain a natural balance. But when the weed growth is excessive, we will attempt to control that growth in those areas.

There are several additional things that we can all do to help our lake stay clean:

- 1. Have your septic tank pumped at least every 2 years.
- 2. Use the appropriate fertilizers, and apply them sparingly. (All bags of fertilizers sold in Oakland county now have the correct mix.)
- 3. If you can, set up a buffer zone of natural growth 6-10 feet from the water's edge.
- 4. Trim all trees hanging over the water. Leaves and branches hanging over the water will always fall into the lake.
- 5. If you are able, rake the lake bottom in front of your home. A clean shoreline can go a long way to improving the entire lake.
