LAKE STUDY

Limnology is the study of the biological, chemical, and physical features of lakes and other bodies of fresh water. Of particular interest to the White Lake riparian owners is the base mapping of the bottomlands and lake health. A digital bathymetric mapping of the lake will show current water depths throughout the entire lake; think of it like a topology map under water. Water quality measurements include dissolved oxygen, phosphorous, chloride, pH, and alkalinity levels concluding with a determination of the lakes trophic state. Vegetation assessments include mapping plant bio-volume throughout the entire lake designating plant species size and location; including native and invasive species.

The Limnological assessment (Lake Study) takes twelve months to complete and collect measurements from all seasons. The plan is to begin the study this year and have results by 2019 that can be put into an action plan for the next Special Assessment if required. The White Lake Improvement Board approved funding for the lake study in the 2018-2020 special assessment. The WLCL will continue to work in partnership with the White Lake Improvement Board and the contracted water resource firm that will conduct the study.

Unfortunately, including your e-mail address on the membership form does not automatically subscribe you. (If
